ABOUT US

Stepping Stones Alliance (SSA) is a non-profit organization in Hermiston, Oregon that currently offers overnight emergency shelter to the homeless in Umatilla and Morrow counties. Along with the shelter and bed, a warm meal is offered daily thanks to volunteer support. Stepping Stones was selected as the contracted agency for Project PATH (Practical Assistance through Transitional Housing) by the county of Umatilla and cities of Umatilla, Hermiston, Echo, and Stanfield to oversee work based on HB 4123. PATH is one of the eight pilot projects selected in the state to provide shelter and support to those without homes. The original group of municipalities recently approved the joining of Irrigon and Boardman. A permanent location is currently being prepared for modular buildings, permanent infrastructure, and utilities. In a phased approach, Stepping Stones will soon progress to phases two and three that will include a Navigation Center which will offer resources to guests, and individual shelter units as the next step from an overnight bed in a communal space to more independence on the path to transitional housing. Stepping Stones is currently working with area organizations to prepare for the offerings at the Navigation Center based on current and future needs of guests.



OUR MISSION

To provide stepping stones – shelter, basic needs and supports that can lead to stability – to people experiencing homelessness.

OUR VISION

A community where all individuals have a safe place to shelter and have access to supports necessary to create stability.



SLEEP CENTER

The Sleep Center offers a low barrier solution and has been in continuous operation every night since opening in December at the 80487 Hwy 395 location.

Between night staff and volunteers, guests are transported from a downtown pick-up location, welcomed into the center, fed a basic evening meal, and given a safe place to sleep for the night.

Breakfast is served in the morning before transportation takes guests back downtown.








SLEEP CENTER NUMBERS

With average nightly stays ranging from 6-16 guests on any given evening, the Sleep Center is offering a much needed service in the region. Over 2,300 night stays have occurred December-July.



Each evening there are 1-2 volunteers to help with check-in and dinner. Night staff work 10 hour shifts and get guests to and from the Sleep Center in a shuttle van. Each morning 1-2 volunteers assist with getting guests up and served breakfast before they depart.

NAVIGATION CENTER

Carolina was hired in January and continues building relationships and seeking the necessary connections that our guests will need with area resources.


Carolina has begun outreach efforts in conjunction with other organizations to reach those in need. Meals and information are being shared with small groups in encampments within the local area.

Tillamook Cheese Factory.




Substantial support has come from The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, PATH communities. and individual citizens.
